### STANDARDIZED TESTING

Standardized testing will be administered to all 2<sup>nd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grade students next week. Please be sure your children are in attendance unless ill and that they are not tardy. The school has the following policy for students taken out of school during the week for any reason other than illness:

"Students taken out during the week of Basic Skills testing for any reason other than illness will be required to make the tests up. The parents will need to make necessary arrangements with the child's teacher. A fee of \$25 per hour will be charged in order to compensate the teacher's time."

### **DID YOU SUBMIT YOUR VOLUNTEER TUITION CREDITS?**

All families who are on a 10-month payment plan need to submit their volunteer hours NOW in order to be applied to your May tuition bill. As stated in school policy, refunds will not be issued.
