#### NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER

#### TUITION ASSISTANCE APPLICATIONS NOW BEING ACCEPTED

FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment will be conducting the financial need analysis for our school for the upcoming 2024-2025 school year. Families applying for financial aid will need to complete an application and submit the necessary supporting documentation to FACTS. Applicants can apply online by clicking the FACTS link at: <a href="https://online.factsmgt.com/signin/3K31M">https://online.factsmgt.com/signin/3K31M</a>. Use your existing FACTS login information to access the site. Once an online application has been completed, you will need to submit supporting documentation which can be uploaded in .pdf or .jpeg format.

There is a \$40 application fee that FACTS charges per application; however, you can have 1 application submitted to multiple schools who use their services without any additional cost (i.e., Veritas). If you have already submitted an application for Veritas, you will need to go into that application and add our school to it. You will not have to start the process all over again.

All applications must be submitted by May 31, 2024. If you have questions or concerns about the application process, please contact us. You may also speak with a FACTS Customer Care Representative at 866-441-4637.
