WINTER'S ON THE WAY - PLEASE DRESS APPROPRIATELY!

Please remember to dress your children appropriately for outdoor play during the winter months. They will continue to have recess outside, weather permitting, and must have coats on in order to go outdoors. They must wear snow pants and boots if they wish to play in the snow (when it arrives). A rule of thumb is that if the temperature is above 15°, they will go outside to play.



SCHOOL SCHEDULE FOR INCLEMENT WEATHER

Our school normally follows the Sussex-Wantage school district regarding delayed openings, closings, and early dismissals. Whenever we close or delay school, we will activate our Parent Reach Notification system. If a 90-minute delay is announced, please be aware that conditions may worsen and cause a full-day cancellation. In such a case, we will again send out another phone notification.



Delayed Openings: The school day will start at 10:10 am. If you drive your children to school on a delayed opening day, please do not bring them any earlier than 9:50 am. There is no one available to supervise your children prior to that time. Before School Care is not available on these days as well. Note: Preschool 3 and Half Day Preschool 4 WILL NOT meet on days when we have a delayed opening.

Early Dismissals: School closes at 12:30 pm on early dismissal days for all grades. Preschools 3 and 4 children should also pick their children up at 12:30 pm. (Note later pickup time for Preschool – this is to make dismissal lines run smoother for everyone.) Aftercare will not be available on early dismissal days.

<u>IMPORTANT NOTE FOR MINISINK & WARWICK BUS RIDERS:</u> If your district is closed, but we are open, busing will not be provided for your children. For delayed openings, the bus will pick students up based upon their delayed opening time. For early dismissals, they will pick students up based upon their closing time.

SCS PARENT ACADEMY

The Spiritual Development Committee invites you to attend an evening Bible Study, "Facing Fear and Anxiety Through Prayer," hosted by committee member and SCS parent, Frank Dollbaum on Friday, December 13 at 7 pm in the Science Room. The study will be anchored to Philippians 4:6-7 and 1 Peter 5:6-7 and will include scripture, personal experience and testimony to encourage others on how to deal with fear through prayer.

"Anxiety" seems to have become a popular term in society that people are willing to accept as a universal condition or acceptable state of living, but it is really a softer term for Fear. Scripture is clear in 2 Timothy 1:7 and 1 John 4:18 that fear of that type does not come from God. The study will demonstrate how to apply these scriptures and others, not simply study them. Fear comes at all of us, but it's not enough to just know what the scriptures say, its understanding and applying them as well. Ultimately, the evening will come to the point about Trust in God, and truly surrendering to Him as He instructs us to do. His peace won't come if we don't allow it.
