TUITION ASSISTANCE APPLICATIONS NOW BEING ACCEPTED

FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment conducts the financial need analysis for our school and is ready to accept applications for the upcoming school year. To apply for aid, you will need to complete an application and submit the necessary supporting documentation to FACTS. Applicants can apply online at https://online.factsmgt.com/signin/3K31M. Use your existing FACTS login information to access the site. Once an online application has been completed, you will need to upload supporting documentation in PDF or JPEG format.

There is a \$40 application fee that FACTS charges per application; however, you can have 1 application submitted to multiple schools who use their services without any additional cost (i.e., Veritas). If you have already submitted an application for Veritas, you will need to go into that application and add our school to it. You will not have to start the process all over again.

<u>All applications must be submitted by May 31, 2025</u>. If you have questions or concerns about the application process, please contact us.




REPTILE SHOW
